Maritime Potable Water System

A well designed fresh water system should provide a safe source of potable water and be accessible for service. Approved, safe materials for tankage and hoses or tubing and best practices for installation will assure the integrity of this vital system.

Starting at the tanks, water flows through a filter that typically can be serviced by cleaning a mesh screen. This protects the pump valves. The pressure pump is commonly a diaphragm type on smaller boats and a vane or centrifugal type on larger boats with higher demands. Pump electrical circuits may include a high pressure cutout switch with diaphragm pumps and a dry tank switch with larger vane or centrifugal pumps. An accumulator tank is typically installed after the pump to reduce pump cycling and reduce pulsations.

City water at the dock can be at a much higher pressure than the pressure aboard the boat, so that a regulator will drop this to match the boat's pump. A check valve is required with dockside supply to keep water from backing up into the tanks or damaging the pump.

The domestic water heater can have cold water entering the tank through a check valve at the bottom and hot water leaving at the top. The heater has a pressure/temperature valve for safety, and it must always be the correct marine type, not the household variety. Hot engine coolant circulates through the heater, and the internal

temperature can be as high as the indicated engine temperature. This is dangerous, so a tempering valve is installed to blend cold water into the hot.

The freshwater system should be disinfected annually to reduce organic growth and keep the water sweet.
